Parish Council Report - September 2025

Councillor Sharkey was warmly welcomed to the Council.

Planning

Much of the meeting was concerned with the issues around planning, both current and proposed, in the village. This was led by Cllr Harland, Head of Planning.

Farleigh Fields East – several units have now been sold.

Farleigh Fields West (off Dark Lane) – More details are expected shortly. A meeting is scheduled with Persimmon Homes (PH) for 17th September. Rodney Road – Cllr Harland thanked Councillors and Dt Cllr Petty for their hard work in monitoring all the issues which had arisen which have been difficult for residents. She reported that she was meeting with Taylor Wimpey (TW) on a regular basis. TW are supporting the Playing Fields and the Scouts by improving the access arrangements.

Cllr Harland told Councillors that parking restrictions will be in force along Rodney Road from 15th September. Cllr Taylor asked that residents be reminded that parking in the laybys by the shops is time restricted.

The Construction Environmental and Traffic Management plans have been approved. BPC will continue to monitor and follow up the report of any breaches with NSC.

Strawberries and Cream Tree - Cllr Harland informed members that the NSC Tree Officer advised that the tree was suffering from the drought, and some remedial action is needed, including a prune. Cllr Harland requested that a note of thanks be sent to the Tree Officer, along with a request for timescales and prior notice so that BPC can notify residents in advance.

Neighbourhood Plan Cllr Harland informed members that Polden Planning will be visiting the village, including Downside, to gather information about the village to help with the formation of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Local Plan Cllr Harland thanked Councillors and Dt Cllr Petty for attending a recent meeting on the Local Plan. Thanks were also extended to the Backwell Residents' Association (BRA) for their recent donation of £5,000.00 as a contribution towards the costs associated with planning matters. The Local Plan is expected to go live on the NSC website on 8th October with a public consultation starting at the end of the month for 6 weeks. BPC & BRA will be working together to safeguard East Backwell.

Other matters

Cllr Ramos updated the meeting about the provision of CCTV at the Railway Station car park. The situation is complex and costly, and Cllr Ramos reminded Councillors that NSC is responsible for the car park and receives the revenue. It was felt that consistent signage would help people make better informed parking decisions. Cllr Power suggested the use of ANPR together with barriers at the entrance and exit. The matter will be followed up with the local

PCSO who initially raised the matter.

Cllr Ould reported that she had further researched the possibility of having a digital noticeboard in the village. Cllr Power is pursuing sources of funding. Councillors unanimously agreed to accept the quotation of £3,430 to chamfer two sides of the Jubilee Stone to enable details of King Charles' coronation to be inscribed.

Councillors unanimously agreed to replace the roundabout at the Moor Lane Play area with a new accessible piece of play equipment.

The next Full Council Meeting will be held at 7.30pm on Thursday, 2nd October 2025 at the Parish Hall. All residents are very welcome to attend.

An update from your North Somerset Councillor In September, I returned to my councillor duties after an extended time away. It has been great to catch up with the community.

I worked recently with Simon Russell (who has set up his own estate agents locally) and together we repainted the phone box on Westfield Road that is used as a book swap. It was lovely to have chats with people passing on a sunny morning. As the weather changes, I have noticed a few places where the brambles are growing. If you get the chance



when you are out and about, we can keep the paths tidy together with a few snips of the secateurs.

For many years the community of Backwell have had update after update on the Local Plan. Successive governments have made bold commitments about housing numbers delivered in a year, they then push these targets to Local Government.

Since Labour were elected in 2024 they increased the target for our area yet again. North Somerset is an area constrained by its coastal landscape, low lying levels as well as rightly protected areas of outstanding natural beauty. The Green Belt is no longer as protected as it once was by this government's target on house building. I know many worry about how our village will change in the future. In my role I am trying to shape the Local Plan to have the best sustainability, affordable housing and commitment to local infrastructure. In October, I expect the Cabinet of North Somerset to vote to put the next version of the Local Plan out for consultation and we will be asked to comment before Christmas.

Monday Cubs

We were delighted when our wolf's head was accepted as a project to be restored at the Repair Shop on BBC 1. I took a group of cubs to The Weald and Downland Museum in Singleton, West Sussex. The episode which featured this and four of our Cubs was broadcast on 12th August. It can be found on BBC iPlayer as Episode 20 in Series 14.

The eight minutes we were on screen took around six hours to film, split into two visits to The Repair Shop. The Cubs were great with ready smiles and lots to say about Cub Scouting and the importance of the wolf's head.

The wolf's head is around seventy years old and it is likely it was acquired when scouting in Backwell was revived in 1955.



It's been used weekly since then by both Cub Packs. Over the years it's been dropped and bashed about a fair bit and was very tatty. We were delighted when the production team responded to our request for a repair. We're so grateful that Kristen and Will took such care with the repair and on making a stand so the wolf's head is stable rather than propped up and wobbly. Everyone is friendly and the level of expertise is astonishing. The way the programme comes across on the telly is exactly how it is.




